



Live the Liturgy Inspiration for the Week

The truth of the Gospel will not always graciously be received. At times, it may be met with rejection and even cause division, even among those we love. We must have courage and always persevere in following God's call and not be sidetracked by the possible ramifications of doing so.

XX Sunday in Ordinary Time

Having reminded the apostles and the crowd that facing the coming judgment takes patience, Jesus now goes on to speak of how difficult it will be to wait. The fire Jesus speaks of here is the distress caused by the coming judgment. That fire will strengthen them to go out to the whole world to preach the good news of Jesus' Resurrection. Jesus will be the first to experience the distress of the coming judgment. His baptism will be the conflict into which He will be immersed as He approaches Jerusalem and His death on the cross.

The coming judgment forces us to look at the implications of our commitments. A commitment of faith requires us to change our attitude toward material possessions and to take even more seriously our moral responsibilities. Here He reminds the crowd that those who commit to Him will find it affects the way they relate to friends and family members. But a commitment to Jesus forces us to change the way we live our lives, and this can put strains on relationships.

We don't expect to hear such difficult words from Jesus in the Gospel. But it is good to be reminded once in a while that the decision to do the right thing, the good thing, is not always easy and without conflict. Jesus Himself did not make easy decisions and avoid conflict. In today's reading, He reminds His followers to be prepared for difficult decisions and conflict as well.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven is celebrated on August 15 and this year it is not a Holy Day of Obligation. Mary, the Mother of God is also our mother. Through Her intercession we are asking for blessings from God for ourselves and our loved ones. On this day we should remember Her and Her part in our lives.



One of the beautiful Polish traditions is blessing of herbs and flowers when we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To keep up with this very old tradition we will have blessing of the herbs and flowers during all the Masses on Monday, August 15th: English Mass at 8:00 a.m.
