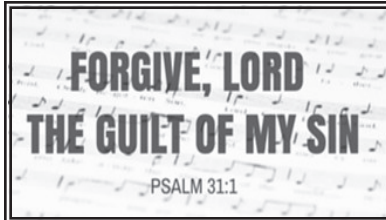

As Americans, we have every right to be proud of our culture, our nation, and our flag. So raise the flag today and every day with pride!

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel Jesus sits down to eat a meal at the house of Simon, a Pharisee. A sinful woman approaches Him, falls to her knees, wets His feet with her tears, dries them with her hair, and then anoints them with oil.

The anonymous woman in the story is a model for each of us. Although a sinner, like any of us, she welcomes the forgiving grace of God, by her gestures of gratitude, humility and love-weeping before Christ, anointing, kissing and cleaning Christ's feet with her hair not with a towel or paper napkin! These are all gestures of love and deeper love. The woman loves more. We are called to love more! This is evidence in the response to the question Jesus put to the judgmental Simon, "when two categories of debtors say, of five hundred days wages and fifty days wages are forgiven, who will be more grateful? Notice, Simon said, the one whose greater debt, five hundred days wages, was forgiven. This is true of the woman, a public sinner, despised, marginalized, mocked by the elites, and rejected by others in the society- whom we are not really sure are holier than the woman. It's only God that knows and sees through our judgment of her!

Forgiveness is a gratuity, a mysterious gift from God. It is a mystery of God's love which anticipates our response and repentance. It urges us to love and pushes us to live not for ourselves, but for Christ, through our relationship with our neighbors. As people forgiven by Christ, set free by His love, may we faithfully go out there and love, and forgive those who may have offended us. Let us hope and pray that no one shall ever be turned away who comes to the Church seeking the love of God that comes to us in Christ Jesus, that no one shall ever be turned away who comes seeking Jesus in our midst.

Sr. Regis Food Cupboard- Summer Help Needed



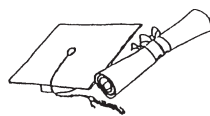

XI Niedziela Zwykła

Szymon chciał bardzo spotkać się z Jezusem, zawrzeć z Nim przyjaźń, pojąć Jego naukę. Ewangelista jednak zostawia nam tylko jedną naukę, do której sprowokowała Jezusa zarówno grzesznica, jak i myśli Szymona – naukę o miłosierdziu. Lekcja o miłosierdziu nie była teoretyczna, lecz bardzo praktyczna – miłosierdzie zostało okazane nie jakiemuś człowiekowi z przypowieści, lecz konkretnej osobie, odległej na wyciągnięcie ręki. Jezus w domu Szymona nie przedyskutował wykładu o miłosierdziu, lecz wprowadził miłosierdzie w życie. Wydarzenie w domu u faryzeusza Szymona jest również przykładem na to, przemieniająca jest łaska spotkania z Chrystusem. Kobieta lekkich obyczajów po spotkaniu z Mistrzem z Nazaretu wybiega z domu lekka, bo wolna od grzechów i zapewniona o miłości. Może w jej lekkości odnajdujemy siebie we wszystkich tych sytuacjach, w których „weszliśmy” grzesznikami, a „wyszliśmy” świętymi, bo rozgrzeszonymi; byliśmy „nieczyści” a wybiegliśmy „czyści”, „smutni” a po kilkunastu minutach kipiała w nas radość? Przypomnijmy sobie te godziny, w których w ogóle nie zamierzając chęci poprawy, jak grom z jasnego nieba spadła na nas chęć naprawienia wszystkiego, rozpoczęcia od nowa, powrotu do wiary czy do ideałów. Ważne, by zapamiętać słowa Jezusa: „Odpuszczone są jej liczne grzechy, ponieważ bardzo umiłowała.” (Łk 7, 47) i o tę miłość – jak owa ewangeliczna kobieta – żebrać.

Przebaczenie jest darem, tajemniczym darem od Boga. Jest to tajemnica miłości Boga, która przewiduje naszą reakcję i skrucę. Jak ludzie przez Chrystusa odpuszczone mają ich grzechy, uwolnione są przez Jego miłość, możemy wiernie iść naprzód i z miłością przebaczyć tym, którzy może nas obrazili. Miejmy nadzieję i modlijmy się, że nikt nie będzie odwrócony kto przychodzi do Kościoła szukając miłości Boga, który przychodzi do nas w Chrystusie Jezusie, że nikt nie powinien być odwrócony który przychodzi szukając Jezusa pośród nas.

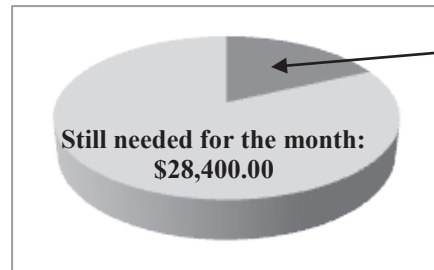
