

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"This is how it is with the Kingdom of God." What is a kingdom? Is it the brick and mortar that build up the castle? Is it the expanse of land a king can reasonably defend? Our notions of kingdoms may be romanticized in the modern era, but for the Israelites, a kingdom held deep historical meaning. Thousands of years before the birth of Christ, the Israelites had asked God for a king. After the reigns of David and Solomon, the united kingdom dissolved into factions, and the land was conquered by the Assyrians, Babylonians, and, finally, Romans. For the Israelites, a kingdom was something to build, both structurally and civilly. While this had ended in ruin for their ancestors, many of Jesus' contemporaries longed for the restoration of an earthly kingdom. Jesus' words in today's Gospel are a radical departure from this perspective. He compares the Kingdom of God to a field, but it appears that the farmer has little to do with its progress. "The seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord, the land yields fruit." Jesus introduces His followers to a new sort of kingdom, a Kingdom where God provides the growth. There is work to be done, of course. "When the grain is ripe, He wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come." But for the Kingdom of God to flourish, there are certain things that are outside of our control. We sow seeds of kindness, justice, and integrity - and then we must be patient. As shoots of faith appear, we nurture the growth with encouragement. As Christians, our task is not to build the Kingdom of God under our power alone, but to trust in the life-giving movement of God.

Why Do We Do That? Catholic Life Explained

Question: Question:

If God knows everything we do, why do we need to go to Confession?

Answer: Another term for the Sacrament of Confession is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We go to this sacrament not only to confess our sins, but to be reconciled with God. Of course, this begs the question, "If I can pray to God on my own, why can't I be reconciled to God on my own?" In the Seven Sacraments, we recognize the importance of community. Sacraments like Baptism or Matrimony happen in the context of the wider Church to remind us of the communal impact of our lives. We are not alone in our walk of faith! We don't need to confess our sins in front of the whole community -- thank God! But going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a tangible reminder that our sins affect not only ourselves and our relationship with God, but others as well. Jesus gave His Apostles authority to forgive sins in His Name. Through this sacrament, we are really, truly forgiven by God Himself. We receive an outpouring of grace and strength to sin no more and our relationship with Christ and His Body, the Church, are restored.

Each Friday join us at 5:00 p.m. for the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Also every Friday we pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy after the 6:00 p.m. Mass.

The Nativity of John the Baptist

The Nativity of St. John the Baptist or Birth of John the Baptist, next Sunday, June 24, is a Christian feast day celebrating the birth of John the Baptist, a prophet who foretold the coming of the Messiah in the person of Jesus,

Ordinarily the day of a saint's death is usually celebrated as his or her feast day, because that day marks his entrance into Heaven. To this rule there are two notable exceptions: the birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary and that of St John the Baptist. According to Catholic tradition and teaching, Mary, already in the first moment of her existence, was free from original sin (her conception itself is commemorated by a separate feast), while John was cleansed of original sin in the womb of his mother whom he later baptised.
